# Hydraulic Elevators


The car for transporting the passengers is raised and lowered by a hydraulic ram – an oil-driven piston inside a cylinder. The cylinder is connected to a fluid-pumping system. There are three parts to the system: a tank, a pump, and a valve.

The tank is at the end of the system. There is a pump between the tank and the cylinder. It pushes the oil into the cylinder. The pressure inside the cylinder increases and pushes the piston up, raising the car.

When the car reaches the correct floor, the control system sends a signal to the electric motor in the pump. This switches the pump off. The car stays where it is.

To lower the car, the control unit sends a signal to the valve. The valve is located in a pipe above the pump. When the valve opens, the weight of the car pushes down on the hydraulic ram and the oil flows slowly back into the tank. To stop the car at a lower floor, the control system closes the valve again.

# Roped elevators

The machine room is at the top of the elevator shaft. There is a control unit in the left-hand corner of the room. There is an electric motor between the control unit and the winch. It turns the winch and lifts the car up and down the elevator shaft.

The car is in the elevator shaft and is connected to three steel ropes. They run from the car, over the winch in the engine room to a counterweight at the back of the shaft.

The car and the counterweight ride on guide rails. The guide rails run along the sides of the shaft and at the back of the shaft. They stop the car and counterweight from hitting each other.

At the bottom of the shaft there is a shock absorber. It is there if something goes wrong and the car drops down the shaft.
